From the Pastor's Desk



This weekend we celebrate the Epiphany, the story of the three wise men who followed the guiding star to Bethlehem. Like the Magi, we are invited to take the spiritual journey that ends on bended knee and requires the offering of precious gifts.

As many of you are aware, one of the calls which arose from the "Share the Dream" process we finished a couple of years ago, was to continue to develop our parish as a center of spirituality and prayer. Next weekend, at our liturgies, we're going to hear a little bit about an ancient ecumenical and interfaith form of "walking our prayer," the Labyrinth. The Labyrinth is an outdoor pathway of an ancient design, emblematic of our spiritual pilgrimage, which offers a place of quiet and reflection. Most in use today are modeled after the one in the French Cathedral, *Chartres*, dating back to the 13th century. Presentation is planning to construct a Labyrinth (with benches and perhaps lighting) on the great lawn on the north side of the property. Please let me know if you'd be interested in helping defray the costs of this project by remembering a loved one.

We're entering the Cornerstone season! If you've never been on this retreat, what a great gift it is to yourself and your family to be part of our 26-hour experience. I can think of nothing better in the new year than to deepen your relationship with God and His Church. It's a very simple, easy overnight here at the parish of reflecting on your spiritual journey with fellow parishioners.

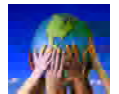

"FRANKly" Speaking

Where Christmas Lights Go to Die
(from <http://blogs.discovermagazine.com>)



In China, companies have discovered a way to recycle old, broken Christmas lights into slippers! Workers untangle the lights and toss them into shredders where they are chopped into tiny fragments and mixed with water into a sticky mud-like substance. Next, they're shoveled onto a large table. As the table shakes, the heavier flecks of copper (from the wire) and brass (from the light bulb sockets) flow in one direction, and the lighter plastic and glass (from the insulation and bulbs) flow in another, isolating the component parts for reuse. The contaminated water flows into a recovery system where it's re-circulated, over and over. The copper and brass have a resale value, but the insulation is used to make soft soles for slippers. So the next time you warm your feet in a pair of slippers, they might just be hotter than you think.
