*The **Chi-Rho** (XP) character superimposes Chi (X) and Rho (P), the first two letters of the name of Christ in Greek, symbolizing Jesus in our midst. The Flame signifies the Holy Spirit which God sends upon us and through whom He calls us into community.*

*The **flame** signifies the Holy Spirit which God sends upon us and through whom He calls us into community.*

*The **circle** depicts the community of people filled with the Holy Spirit called together to worship God with Jesus present in our midst.*

*The **extension of the X** outside the circle represents all of us who, through Baptism, are called to become one body in Christ by serving God through helping others. God gives each of us gifts and talents for us to share with the community and with those in need.*

EXPLORE YOUR GIFTS FOR MINISTRY

Are you unsure where God may be calling you to serve? Are you interested in exploring your gifts/skills/talents? A gifts inventory and personal interview are available through the parish. ADULT CHOIR: Our adult choir helps our community worship through song primarily at the 11:30 am Liturgy on Sundays from September through June. There are two concerts given each year, one during the Christmas Season and one in the Spring.

ALTAR MINISTRY: Would you like to help keep the sacred space that is our altar worthy of the Lord? If so, then this flexible ministry would be perfect for you.

ALTAR SERVERS: You are invited to serve as Altar Servers at Liturgies. Training sessions are held several times a year. This ministry is opened to children in grade 4 through adults.

ANNOINTING OF THE SICK: Join this team and feel the spirit of God transcend through us as we touch upon those who are suffering from poor health, physically, mentally, or emotionally. A special anointing liturgy is scheduled every spring and fall at 11:00 am with a luncheon immediately following.

BABYSITTING MINISTRY: Do you love children? Do you like spending a few hours of your time helping the Church, while enjoying the laughter of little ones? There are many opportunities to serve as a babysitter for parish events. This is a great way to volunteer for short periods of time that fit your schedule.

BAPTISM SEAMSTRESS: If you're a good seamstress this ministry could use your expertise. There are about 275 baptisms here every year and each baby receives a beautiful hand-made garment which is worn at the baptism and then saved as an heirloom. This work can be done at home.

BAPTISM TEAM: The baptism ministry seeks volunteers to assist the priest and couples with the baptism ceremony itself. There is no mandatory time commitment. A willingness to be welcoming and ensure that the ceremony runs smoothly are the gifts that are required. All ages are welcome to help. This is a fun ministry!

BEREAVEMENT: The many facets of emotions of grief are offered to desensitize the pain of losing a loved one. Come join us and receive the spiritual and emotional support that you may desire through an eight week bereavement support group.

SUNDAY EVENING CHOIR: This is a contemporary ensemble that meets to rehearse, one hour before the 6:30 pm Sunday Liturgy. They join with the adult choir for Christmas and Easter Liturgies, as well as for concerts.

20/30 (Young Adult) Ministry: Our parish recognizes that the years between 20 and 40 are huge in a person's life. During these years of life, crucial decisions are made about vocations, relationships, and faith. We are currently trying to build this important ministry to our Young Adults with 4 goals in mind: connecting young adults to God through a relationship with Jesus Christ; connecting young adults to the Church and Christian community, connecting young adults to the mission of the Church in the world, and connecting young adults to a peer community to further support and nurture their faith.

As we build this ministry, we seek to offer a variety of programs and opportunities for our Young Adults, college -aged and post-college. If you desire to journey with young adults, or if you are a young adult yourself, looking to connect with other young adults, this ministry is for you.

USHERS: Ushers welcome parishioners at Mass and show parishioners to their seats. The ushers also take up the collection and distribute the bulletins after Mass.

WEDDING ANNIVERSARY: A happy ministry of volunteers that provide a liturgy and dinner dance every spring to parishioners celebrating their anniversary in five-year increments.

WELCOME DINNER TEAM: All newly registered parishioners are invited to attend a welcoming dinner that is annually. This dinner offers new members an opportunity to meet other new members as well as to learn more about our parish. Volunteers are needed to help cook, serve, clean up and to be table facilitators. This is a wonderful opportunity for anyone who wants to take

part in what Presentation is best known for -- Welcoming!

WOMEN'S BOOK GROUP: The Women's Book Club meets the **second Tuesday of the month from January through June at 9:30 AM and 7:30 PM.**

We welcome anyone who wants to enjoy thoughtful discussion of books in a community of women on a spiritual journey. This is NOT a literary book club; therefore, although it is always helpful to have read the month's book selection, it is not a prerequisite to join in the conversation. We welcome your participation.

WOMEN'S SPIRITUALITY: Women's Spirituality provides spiritual opportunities for the women of the Parish to nurture, deepen and support their growth in their relationship with God. The ministry sponsors monthly communion breakfasts, a bi-monthly book group, a women's Mass in May, a Christmas Tea in December and special spiritual events related to women.

WORKDAY: Time to give back and appreciate our Church...our volunteers set aside one day out of the year to clean and repair our Parish. A hardy breakfast and lunch is served to our dedicated workers. Come, let's work together and show our love and devotion to our house of worship.

order to be a part of this ministry, but somewhat regular attendance is appreciated. Intentions of the community are remembered during this time.

SENIOR HIGH YOUTH MINISTRY:

Our Youth Ministry program works to foster the total person and spiritual growth of each young person, seeks to draw young people to responsible participation in the life, mission, and work of the Catholic Christian faith community, and empowers them to become disciples of Jesus Christ who witness to their faith in their daily lives. If you want to make a real impact in the lives of young people then volunteering with our youth ministry is right for you! Teenagers always benefit from other adults who are willing to mentor them and journey with them. We have many different activities during the year with which you can get involved. A preliminary meeting with the Youth Minister will help determine the right placement for your interests.

SEPARATED & DIVORCED: A nine week ministry offered twice a year to those experiencing the grief of separation and divorce. Our trained facilitators reach out to help make this transition a period of growth and spiritual awakening. This challenging journey will help transform your life from wounded emotions to a greater source of healing.

SINGLES MINISTRY: This ministry offers social and cultural events to singles. We have a Singles web page denoting a myriad of interesting programs. Our agenda is to bring people together and enhance their social needs to a heightened sense of purpose.

SMALL CHRISTIAN

COMMUNITIES: A **Small Christian Community (SCC)** is a small group of adults who gather on a regular basis to discuss their lives in the light of the Gospel

and to share their Christian faith through prayer, friendship, and service. The SCC Core Community is the ministry team that helps form, sustain and enrich our small Christian communities. Join us in this exciting ministry!

SOUP KITCHEN: The Soup Kitchen Ministry offers our parish community the opportunity to live out the call of the gospel by feeding the poor and seeing the face of Jesus in those who are hungry not only for food, but also for love and compassion. Each week two teams prepare a meal in the Presentation kitchen for Newark and Harlem. Teams from our faith community deliver and serve the food to our guests. At Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter, we invite the whole parish community to help us prepare a banquet for the poor in Newark, Harlem and the Bronx. Many generous hands make it possible to feed about 800 guests for each holiday.

ST. FRANCIS MINISTRY: We are called by God to be stewards of creation—not to consume, waste, and exploit God’s bounty but to protect and preserve it for the glory of God and for future generations. The goal of the St. Francis Ministry, introduced in 2010, is to transform Presentation into a “green parish” by generating less waste, recycling, and reducing our carbon footprint. You are welcome to join our ministry or simply participate in a project.

ST. PAT’S TWINNING: St. Patrick’s Parish in Jersey City is our “sister parish.” Our parishes have been in partnership for many years. Volunteers are needed at St. Pat’s School on a regular basis in the areas of tutoring and art. Please help us continue this very special relationship. No experience is necessary.

BIBLE CAMP TEAM: This team provides a fulfilling opportunity to share with early elementary school age children for one week in July. There are opportunities to volunteer in arts & crafts, games, recreation, music and snack assembly. It’s a quick week that doesn’t take much preparation, so even if your time is limited, this is a great chance for you to touch the lives of our parish children.

BIBLE STUDY: This group meets three sessions per year to study and discuss various books of the Bible. The sessions usually run for six to eight weeks. The group is open to new members at the beginning of each session.

CAREER MANAGEMENT: Share your expertise in the career world and offer guidance and advice to those who are unemployed. The focus of the ministry is to lend a sympathetic ear and provide assistance with resumes, interviews and job-hunting techniques.

CAREGIVERS REST STOP: If you have a few hours to give periodically to sit with a homebound parishioner while their caretaker takes a break, you should consider this ministry. All that’s required is a person that can sit and visit. No health care is necessary.

CARING STITCHES MINISTRY: The caring stitches ministry welcomes people that knit, crochet, sew or quilt. The participants create shawls, lap blankets and quilts that are made to comfort people in time of need or loss. As members make shawls or quilts, each recipient is prayed for as every stitch is taken. When the gifts are presented to the person, they radiate prayers of comfort and the knowledge that we have been thinking about them throughout the process. Patterns will be available, or you can bring your own.

CATECHUMENATE: The Catechumenate is the Catholic Church’s welcoming invitation to non-Catholic men and women curious about Catholic beliefs and practices. The Catechumenate also guides the inquirer to full sacramental membership in the Catholic Church (by celebrating the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist). A team of parishioners serve as sponsors and catechists for these adults, providing many opportunities for inquirers to experience Church community, prayer, beliefs, and service.

CELEBRATE THE DANCE

RETREAT: This retreat is a gathering of couples for a weekend of prayer, faith sharing and intimate time to celebrate both the blessings and challenges in our married lives.. The retreat takes place during the winter months at Mt. Saint Alphonsus Retreat Center in Esopus, N.Y. The retreat consists of a mixture of quiet time for couples, talks given by the team and a number of activities centered on the sacrament of marriage.

CHILDREN’S CHOIR: This group, open to all children in grades three through eight, sings at the Christmas Pageant and at the Family Mass on the first Sunday of each month from October through May. The group also performs at their annual Christmas concert.

CHILDREN’S LITURGY OF THE WORD: Help the Gospel come alive to children!!! If you enjoy working with our younger parishioners and have an hour or so a month, this may be the ministry for you. All materials are supplied and you can prepare at home and spend about one hour a month at Church to share God’s word. Many have found this to be a worthwhile ministry to share with their older children.

CORNERSTONE RETREAT: Our stories are part of God's story, and only through sharing and owning our stories—the good and the bad—can we truly begin to understand and accept ourselves and others and to see how God is working in our lives. Cornerstone is a 26-hour retreat, allowing adults to become more actively involved in their spiritual development by examining and perhaps sharing their own stories, reflecting upon others, forming meaningful relationships and building community with God. Cornerstone is offered separately for men and women once a year and is held at the Church from Friday night to Saturday evening. The team is comprised of retreat-ants from the previous year who make a yearlong commitment to prepare the next Cornerstone. Participants often join team and/or form Small Christian Communities to continue their spiritual growth in the knowledge and love of God while helping others do the same.

COUNTING MINISTRY: This dedicated team meets once a week to count and deposit the previous Sunday and Holy Day collections. This is a good match for a retired person or a person with some free time.

ELIZABETH MINISTRY: One can only reap the blessings God will bestow upon those joining this most sensitive and caring ministry. We offer healing and hope through faith and love to those grieving the loss of a child through death, a complicated pregnancy, or through tragedy.

ENVIRONMENT MINISTRY: Volunteers are needed to bring a touch of color and beauty to our Church and our grounds. This ministry gives an opportunity to meet other parishioners and to share decorating skills. All that is needed are willing hands and an open heart.

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTERS: Eucharistic Ministers serve for Holy Days, Sundays and weekday Masses. Training sessions are held for all ministers and are offered throughout the year. Eucharistic Ministers are also needed for visitations to the homebound.

FAMILY FORMATION

VOLUNTEER: Are you a great storyteller? Do you like working with audio-visual equipment or have a knack for photography, music or know the ins and outs of a web page? Do you have experience as a catechist? If you said yes to one or some of these questions, this ministry is for you. Invest in your own renewal and in the healthy faith life of the parish by becoming a faith formation volunteer. Learn on the job, with lots of guidance and support. Parents with school age children rely on the efforts of community members, both as models of Christian living, and as volunteers who help the parish provide a wide range of learning opportunities for their families. The work and time commitments are minimal, but the rewards are great.

FAMILY EVENTS: Perhaps you only have time to volunteer once or twice a year. A one-time event may be perfect for you. Would you like to work on a family event? There's Mardi Gras, St. Nick's breakfast, Soup Supper, the May Crowning, movie nights etc....There's always some event that would suit your skills and time commitment.

FIRST EUCHARIST TEAM: It is truly a blessing when you encounter Christ in the joyful faces of a child and his/her family who have journeyed together and have come prepared to celebrate the Eucharist! The First Eucharist Team ministry works diligently to **complement the family-focused preparation process** by offering monthly liturgies, two retreat days, rehearsal days and by welcoming the families at each of these gatherings. Your commitment of time and the gifts you

knowledge is required, just a desire to help while giving Hope. Oh, The Power of One!

PARISH OFFICE VOLUNTEERS:

Volunteers provide a welcoming presence in responding to incoming phone calls and office visitors. Duties include answering the phone and assisting parishioners and visitors with Mass cards and questions. Volunteers are asked to give a minimum of four hours twice a month on weekdays and weekend mornings. Training is provided.

PARISH PICNIC: A celebration of fun filled activities for all ages. Join in the festivities of animal shows, sporting events, dancing, live music and our delicious food. We welcome you to help volunteer to make this picnic of 2010 a success and enjoy our parish fellowship.

PASTORAL CARE FOR THE HOSPITAL & HOMEBOUND: When you are sick and can't make it to Mass, we miss you. Pastoral Care Ministers bring the love of our parish family to the sick and hold the hands of those who can't be there to hold our hands at the Lord's Prayer on Sunday. When someone's illness causes them to be hospitalized, homebound or in a nursing home for a significant period of time, a trained member of our community will visit them. During the visit, the pastoral care minister will bring Communion and pray with the person who is sick. The primary goal of the Pastoral Care Minister is to bring Christ's listening and accepting presence to the bedside of the ill person. While doctors and nurses provide physical health care and advice, the pastoral care minister can help tend to the spiritual dimension of illness.

PRESENTATION SENIORS: A ministry for our Seniors where they meet the 2nd Monday of the month to enjoy fellowship. In addition, we have a great selection of interests from day trips, to vacation trips and entertainment. In

December we celebrate Christ's birth with a beautiful Mass followed by a delicious luncheon and a seasonal show.

PRO-LIFE MINISTRY: As Catholics, we all have a responsibility to actively promote an ongoing and renewed respect for human life, from conception till natural death. In response, we heartily answer yes to Pope John Paul II's "urgent call for a general mobilization of consciences and a united ethical effort to activate a great campaign in support of life. All together, we must build a new culture of life". As a ministry our efforts are directed through Prayer, Education, Advocacy and community Outreach.

PROSTATE CANCER SUPPORT GROUP: "You are not alone" — simple words but critical in a health care crisis. That's why Life Lines, a supportive, confidential and informative resource for prostate cancer patients and their partners was born. Created by prostate cancer patients, we meet monthly to share information and experience concerning available treatment and service resources. We don't give medical advice—only insight, information and support based on our individual experiences.

REPAIR & MAINTENANCE MINISTRY: This ministry helps to keep our Church in "tip top" shape. If it's broken, if assembly is required, if it doesn't work, a crew will repair it, put it together or get it working. Volunteers receive on-the-job training if needed. Our motto: "HE was a carpenter and teacher."

RESURRECTION CHOIR: Any adult who has time and enjoys singing, meets on the morning of a funeral to offer comfort to the bereaved through appropriate music for the liturgy.

ROSARY: The rosary is said every weekday following the 9:00 am Mass. Daily participation is not necessary in

HOOR WITH JESUS: There is Eucharistic Devotion in the chapel every Wednesday from noon until 9:00 pm. People are asked to sign up for one or more hours to pray in the presence of the Eucharist.

JOURNEY RETREAT: Journey is an "off-site" retreat weekend, held separately for men and women. This is a time for faith sharing and spiritual growth to awaken to the presence of God in their lives. It challenges the retreatants to continue to grow in their relationship with God through personal talks, group sharing, prayer and the Sacraments.

JUNIOR HIGH FAITH FORMATION: Our Junior High Faith Formation program is for young people in the 7th and 8th grades. During the course of the year, we need volunteer Catechists and classroom aides, volunteer table leaders for retreat days and service projects. This is an exciting ministry that encourages young adolescents to gain a better understanding of the Church and their faith. If you would like to journey with young people and challenge them to live their Christian faith, then this ministry is for you.

JUSTICE & PEACE: The Justice and Peace Ministry strives to engage people in reflecting upon their life and circumstances in light of the Gospel call to justice. The ministry meets monthly for prayer, discussion and planning. This ministry provides educational opportunities about social justice issues and enables people to respond in Christian action. These include the Fair Trade Sale, Hunger Banquet and Film Series. Another activity of this ministry is the Offering of Letters Campaign, when parishioners are invited to write letters to the members of Congress asking them to support U. S. legislation that will help the poor and hungry people in the U. S. and abroad.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS: The Knights of Columbus provides spiritual, social and outreach opportunities. The Knights of Columbus of Presentation conducts a variety of activities and services in support of the Church, the community, families and youth. Through these events, they are able to donate to charities, various scholarships and the poor.

LECTORS: At Liturgies, lectors read the appointed Scripture of the day and general intercessions. All lectors are required to attend a training session for Liturgical Ministers. A workbook containing the Scripture for every Sunday of the year, is given to all lectors so that they may prepare their readings and thus become true ministers of the Word.

LIBRARY MINISTRY: The Library Ministry keeps the Church library in order, re-shelves returned books and orders new supplies as needed.

MEN'S MINISTRY: This ministry provides opportunities for men to gather in community for prayer, reflection and fellowship.

MOM'S MINISTRY: Couldn't every Mom use a little extra support and encouragement? Taking care of children is one of the most rewarding yet challenging experiences. Meet and converse with other Mom's on how to achieve a spiritual balance. Join us in the Mom's Ministry for weekly playgroups, outreach programs, guest speakers and conversation.

NEW ORLEANS MINISTRY: The New Orleans Ministry was formed in early 2007, after two groups from our church spent a week at a time in St. Bernard Parish, rebuilding the homes of local residents. Our goal is to return two times a year (May and January likely) until the city is rebuilt. No previous construction

bring to the ministry are valued and appreciated. Serving on this ministry, you can help ensure that these sacramental celebrations are spiritual and meaningful for the children and their families.

"FLYING SOLO" LIFE IN A SINGLE WORLD: After the difficult, emotional, and sad experience of separation and divorce, how do we move into our new lives with grace & dignity? Flying Solo is about confronting and discussing the issues that arise after divorce. It is a safe environment to create a support system that is uniquely your own. This is an eight week program comprising of a series of round table discussions with a "relaxed" format customized to meet the individual needs of the single person.

FUNERAL BOOKLET TEAM: Consider this ministry if you have a computer and internet access. A booklet takes less than an hour to create using templates and pictures provided by the funeral ministry. It is a wonderful way to serve the Presentation community, but still have the flexibility to do the work from your home at your convenience.

FUNERAL COOKING TEAM: If you like cooking and working with a team, the funeral ministry could use you. This rewarding ministry helps prepare meals for families and friends after a funeral.

FUNERAL SERVING TEAM: Are you a person who is good at planning events? If so, perhaps you could be part of a team who helps set-up and serve at a funeral luncheon. This is a good opportunity for anyone who periodically has a few free hours during the day.

GAY & LESBIAN SUPPORT GROUP: This ministry gathers monthly in a welcoming, confidential setting at church to exchange information and encouragement.. Gay and lesbian Catholics of all ages, parents, family and friends who are interested are welcome to

attend. *"We call on all Christians...to confront their own fears about homosexuality and to curb the humor and discrimination that offend homosexual persons and their families."* US Bishops Statement from ALWAYS OUR CHILDREN, P. 10.

GREEN THUMB MINISTRY: Do you enjoy gardening? Would you like to help make our courtyard, inside plants, etc. more beautiful? Then, join the team that will help beautify our Church.

GREETERS: Greeters help welcome parishioners and distribute bulletins after Mass. They work on a rotating schedule of their preferred Mass and are usually scheduled about eight times a year.

HAITI PARISH TWINNING MINISTRY: This ministry was established in 2002 to lead the twinning relationship with St. Michele in Fond Jean-Noel, Haiti. The people of Fond Jean-Noel identified medical assistance as their primary need. Since then, our mission has moved to Cavallion, Haiti, where we continue to do medical missions. Presentation has committed to go to Haiti with a team of parishioners, doctors, nurses and translators every six months to run a free medical clinic for one week.

HEALTH MINISTRY: If you are a registered, certified nurse or physician, please keep in mind this wonderful ministry. We can always use more volunteers for this very caring Ministry. We focus on the prevention of sickness and poor health. We do blood pressure screenings after Sunday Masses.

HOSPITALITY MINISTRY: If you enjoy organizing social gatherings and hosting parties, this ministry is the ministry for you. Help plan and run monthly "meet and greet" gatherings.
