#### FROM THE PASTOR

A word about this past **<u>Holy Week</u>**. I find it a hectic but very beautiful period filled with so many experiences that it's difficult to find time to reflect on them! Holy Thursday begins with Morning Prayer, then the priests of Bergen County gather for noonday prayer & lunch. For the past 30 years, I've hosted my staff to a lamb supper (celebrating the supper of the Lamb of *God*) and finally, the Mass of the Last Supper, which is the anniversary of the Eucharist and the priesthood. What a remarkable day! Good Friday begins with Morning Prayer, followed by the Bicycle Stations (a unique approach taken by our parish), the Passion Service (the only day of the year when we celebrate Christ's death without a Mass). Good Friday ends with our Youth Ministry's Living Stations of the Cross. I always sleep well after those two days!

So much work and effort is expended to put our large parish through Holy Week and <u>many</u> <u>thanks</u> to the army who made it happen. Let's continue to be a community that attracts people to the Lord – that so impressed our Catechumens and Candidates that they wanted to join us.

Next weekend, should you come to an early Mass, you'll see our teens sleeping on the lawn as part of our <u>Youth Ministry's Homeless</u> <u>Overnight Retreat</u>. This popular service experience helps raise awareness of hunger, homelessness and poverty as they bring clothing and supplies to the homeless in New York City and experience a little bit of homelessness themselves. Thank you to all who have donated to their outreach efforts. I'm thrilled to announce that thanks to your generosity, we have <u>exceeded our Annual</u> <u>Appeal goal</u> of \$168,000. We have currently received pledges of \$203.002 from 290 donors (507 donated to last year's Appeal ). Feel free to continue to support this wonderful cause, a sign of our parish's good stewardship.

I recently saw the movie, "Cabrini," about our first American Catholic saint. It highlights her work with Italian immigrants to our country in the late 1800's and early 1900's. She was setting up orphanages and then hospitals, and it follows her early attempts at trying to make headway dealing with the Church fathers and the politicians. At one point, there's an explosion killing many of the immigrants building the tunnel under the Hudson River. I thought of the Irish immigrants who labored and were killed building the tunnel from the Croton Reservoir to NYC and it's hard not be reminded of the immigrants who died last week when the Francis Scott Key bridge in Baltimore collapsed. May we look to help all of those in these desperate situations. Thanks for your support most recently for Haiti at the Casino Night. I'm happy to report that parishioner Bobby Williams has just joined the Board of Directors of Catholic Charities, which is powered by our Annual Appeal funds, enabling them to help so many of the needy in our state.

Please join with your family members, they are welcome to help as always. We need as many people as possible so that we can cover all the shifts.



Today's readings: Acts 4:32-35; Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24; 1 John 5:1-6; John 20:19-31. On this Second Sunday of Easter, the Church also celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. The readings today reveal some of the many facets of God's mercy. The psalm proclaims that "his mercy endures forever," and in the Gospel, Jesus enacts that mercy as he greets the disciples in peace. In a loving manner, Jesus helps the group of disciples overcome doubt about the resurrection. Though his followers do not recognize him, he is gentle, beginning both visits with the greeting, "Peace be with you."
